



2014-2015 SAGE Data

Our SAGE data for the 2014-2015 year was published in September. We are close to the Alpine School District average in Language Arts, Math, and Science. We are pleased with what our students achieved last year and are working hard to ensure they make even more progress this year.



Early-out Mondays

Early-out Mondays are an excellent opportunity for the faculty to focus on students. Teachers and administrators utilize this time to map curriculum according to the Utah core, create common assessments, and discuss best practices in order help students achieve at high levels. Each Monday, teachers focus on the following four critical questions:

- 1. What do we want students to learn?
- 2. How will we know what students have learned?
- 3. How will we respond to students who aren't learning?
- 4. How will we respond to students who already know the material?

2015-2016 School Land Trust Funds and Goal

We have two goals for this year. The first is that the number of students in kindergarten through third grade that are reading on grade level will increase by at least 1%. Our second goal is that the number of students that are proficient on the SAGE test will increase by at least 2%. Some of the things that we are doing to achieve this goal are:

- *Target Time (targeted instruction for students by grade level and achievement level);
- *Double Dosing (for students that need extra practice);
- *Teachers observing and discussing best teaching practices;
- *Hiring aides to work with students;
- *Purchasing books for the library and classrooms;
- *Purchasing technology (iPads and Chromebooks) for student use;
- *Purchasing math and science supplies.

We are well on our way to reach this goal and appreciate the support of the parents and teachers in helping the students achieve at high levels.

We have been given \$61,355 from the School Land Trust funds this year. This money is being used to fund the items listed above. These funds have helped our students make great progress and we are very grateful for them.


*Belief-We believe all of our students can achieve at high levels.
