Welcome Back to School Explorers!!!! I would like to take this opportunity to express to you my excitement about being the principal at Foothill Elementary School – particularly this year. As Foothill Explorers, the faculty and staff consistently rally around our schools mission statement that declares that we are “Inspiring a passion for learning . . . 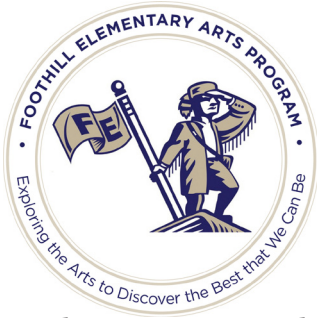

We are excited for another great year of Art at Foothill Elementary!!! ART IS FUN! Art also fosters creativity and stimulates the mind. Involvement in the arts is associated with gains in math, reading, cognitive ability, critical thinking, and verbal skills. The arts can also improve motivation, concentration, confidence, and teamwork in children.

NURSING NEWS

Utah has been experiencing a high rate of **Pertussis** over the past 18 months. Pertussis (whooping cough) is a contagious disease characterized by cold symptoms such as a runny nose and an irritating cough. This infection can be life-threatening in small children. In previously immunized teenagers and adults it frequently presents as a very persistent and sometimes severe cough that lasts for weeks. This can be spread to others, including infants and other high risk individuals. Therefore, it is important to be diagnosed and receive treatment. If pertussis is present, close contacts should receive preventive antibiotics if they are in a high risk category. A high risk person is someone who is:

- *an infant under the age of 1 year
- *pregnant
- *inadequately immunized under the age of 7 years
- *an individual with chronic or immunocompromised conditions

Vaccination is the best prevention against pertussis and gives protection from future exposures. A booster vaccine (Tdap) is now available for teenagers and adults. This vaccine is recommended as neither the childhood vaccine nor the illness creates a lifelong immunity to the disease. By notifying the public about pertussis risk, we are trying to control the spread and prevent new cases of this illness.

During the fall months this year, various school-based immunization clinics will be offered to further prevent the spread of this disease and other diseases such as the flu. Information will be sent out later with dates, times, and locations of these immunization clinics. Welcome back to school! I'm looking forward to a great year!!!!

Dear Parents & Students of Foothill Elementary,

EXPLORER TIME:

As a staff we have created a 30-minute period of the day we call Explorer Time. During this time, Tuesday – Friday, students who need just a little extra instructional support to re-learn important concepts will receive that extra help in our Extra Miler Club. At the same time, other students will be provided enrichment/extension-learning opportunities meant to enhance their learning. Here are a few of the highlights of Explorer Time:

- Teacher activities with that will change week-to-week on a rotational basis (i.e. – Science Club, Math Club, Foreign Language Club, Brain Games, Music, Art, Healthy Lifestyles, Fitness, Prevention Dimensions, and more).
- Study Hall for those students who need to catch up on unfinished/missing work

- Lower Grade Explorer Time 3:00-3:30
