We are just beginning the third trimester of the year and I wanted to give you an update of the many great things happening at Foothill right now.

STEM Education: Foothill Elementary is a STEM school as we integrate science, technology, engineering, and mathematics into our instruction and classrooms. We also add the arts to make it STEAM. Throughout this year, our teachers have received professional development from BYU technology and engineering professor, Dr. Steve Shumway. He has helped our teachers learn how to teach science more effectively through the engineering design process. This type of teaching is rich as students work in groups to explore how to solve real-world problems much like an engineer would. This type of creative problem solving helps students to think and understand STEM concepts at a much deeper level. We are also excited that we have received a significant grant to further this professional development in the summer. We will continue to build upon these effective principles, as we more fully become a STEM school.

Student Recognition: Over these past couple of months, Foothill students have represented our school very well. Twenty of our students' science projects made it to the district science fair. Ten of these students did well enough to move on to BYU for the final science fair. Also, a number of our students took the national math assessment called the AMC 8. Thirteen of our students were recognized for their superior performance when compared with students across the state and nation.

Student Competitions: Lately, we have enjoyed several healthy competitions at Foothill. The National Geography Bee went well with students learning about geography around the world. Our PTA sponsored spelling bee went well. It was amazing that two of our top three winners were in 3rd grade. This past week, our Knowledge Bowl teams had a competition in preparation for the district Knowledge Bowl. In a couple of weeks we will have our annual storytelling competition. All of these competitions encourage students to work hard and to enjoy their learning.

We look forward to the end of this school year. I feel confident that our students will continue to learn and perform well because of our phenomenal teachers and the support of our wonderful parents. I am truly blessed to be the principal at Foothill Elementary.



## **NURSING NEWS**

Dear Parents,

Button batteries are small, coin-shaped batteries found in watches, calculators, and other small electronic devices.

These shiny batteries can attract infants, toddlers, and preschoolers, who easily can put them in their mouths or up their noses. When swallowed, button batteries can become lodged in the throat (esophagus) and cause choking or interfere with swallowing solid foods. When swallowed, a battery can travel through the digestive tract or get stuck somewhere along the way and cause serious and life-threatening injuries within just 2-3 hours.

If you find a toy or device with a battery missing or you suspect your child might have swallowed a battery, look for the following symptoms:

\*nausea and vomiting \*diarrhea

\*fever \*discolored or bloody stool

\*coughing \*irritability \*abdominal pain \*throat pain

\*breathing problems \*refusal to eat or drink

If your child has any symptoms associated with ingesting a battery, go to an emergency room immediately. It's best to err on the side of caution and have your child checked out even if you think your child swallowed a battery but you don't see symptoms yet.

- \*Call 911 or go the ER immediately
- \*Do not try to make your child throw up
- \*Don't let your child eat or drink
- \*Tell the doctors that you believe your child swallowed a button battery. An X-ray will be done to see if the battery is in your child's body.
- \*If a battery is stuck in your child's body, it has to be removed to prevent further injury.

#### **PREVENTION**

- \*CHECK PRODUCTS THAT USE BUTTON BATTERIES TO MAKE SURE BATTERY COMPARTMENTS ARE SECURELY CLOSED.
- \*KEEP PRODUCTS THAT USE BUTTON BATTERIES OUT OF THE REACH OF UNSUPERVISED CHILDREN.
- \*WATCH KIDS CAREFULLY WHENEVER THEY USE DEVICES CONTAINING BATTERIES.
