Each Monday, our teachers meet together to collaborate and discuss how best to help meet the specific, unique needs of students and help each child reach their full potential. You may ask, "What is a collaborative team and what do they do?" Let me try to answer that question for you.

The Four Essential Questions drive everything that a collaborative team does. All of these questions are focused on individual students and their learning.

The Four Essential Questions:

- 1. What do we expect students to learn?
- 2. How will we know if students have learned it?
- 3. How do we help students who have not yet learned it?
- 4. How will we extend the learning for students who already know it?

In the past, teachers usually worked in isolation, making many, if not all, decisions on their own. As teachers work together collaboratively they are more able to meet the needs of their students. As the saying goes, "Two heads (or more) are better than one." At Foothill, each team views all of the students in their grade level as their students, not only the students in their class.

Some of the most important work done in a collaborative team is to create the following living documents that guide and drive instruction. These include:

- A Curriculum Map that guides the entire team and the instruction they will provide throughout the year.
- Common Assessments that inform the team of student needs and provide data to drive their instruction.
- Providing systematic Interventions for students who do not understand and learn.
- Providing authentic Enrichments to extend the learning of those who already understand the material.

At Foothill Elementary, our teachers work together effectively in a collaborative culture. All of their efforts combined help provide students with the best instruction possible. When students have additional needs, teachers work together to find ways to help each and every child learn. Our collaborative culture at our school is one of many reasons why Foothill is so phenomenal!

NURSING NEWS

'NEVER LEAVE YOUR CHILD ALONE IN THE CAR!"

Between 1998 and 2011, nearly 525 children died as a result of being left alone in a car. By leaving your children unattended in a vehicle for even a few minutes, you are needlessly risking their lives.

SAFETY FACTS

- *More than 30% of children who die from being left in a hot car are under the age of one.
- *Cracking your vehicle's windows has very little effect on its temperature.
- *Your car's internal temperature can increase by 19 degrees Farenheit in only 10 minutes. This applies to winter months as well.
- *When left in a hot vehicle, a child's body temperature can increase three to five times as fast as an adult's.
- *Children left unattended in a vehicle are at risk of being kidnapped.
- *Children left alone in a car can push buttons, disengage the brakes, put the car in gear or even leave the vehicle and walk away.

PREVENTION STEPS

- *NEVER leave your child unattended in a vehicle.
- *Make a habit of checking your vehicle before leaving it.
- *Keep a stuffed animal or other reminder next to you in the car as a cue that your child is with you.
- *If you see a child left alone in a car, contact the police or call 911.
