Great things are happening at Foothill! Here is a brief update on several of our endeavors.

explorer

STUDENTS:

- Foothill sent 20 students on to the district science fair this year. Of those 20, 12 will move on to the state level and three received honorable mention. The school with the next highest number of students moving on to the state level had 8 students.
- On the national AMC 8 mathematics test, Foothill had 11 students recognized for their excellent scores. That is quite an impressive showing on a nationally competitive test!

STEAM:

- Last month, we submitted our application to receive the STEM designated from the Utah STEM Action Center. We will find out in April if we receive this prestigious designation.
- All of our teachers are using STEAM to enhance and deepen the learning of students. For teacher observations, I have been fortunate to see many phenomenal STEAM lessons from kindergarten to 6th grade and in all of the classrooms in the school, including our small-group autism classes. It is exciting to see the engagement, problem solving, and deeper learning of our students in all of our classrooms.
- We have created a Makers Cart with all kinds of STEAM materials for teachers to use in their classrooms as their students create, design, and engineer.

TECHNOLOGY:

- The majority of our teachers took a 2-day training that was hosted at Foothill from UEN (Utah Education Network) entitled, "Teaching and Learning with iPads." Lots of great learning occurred.
- The district recently installed 17 new wireless access points and updated the other access points to the newest and best wireless network available.
- We hired a technology aide for three hours a day to support our teachers in the integration of technology in their classrooms.

CLASS SIZES:

 Thanks to our Epic Technology grant we received this year, we will be able to allocate more funding to reducing class sizes. Recently, our School Community Council allocated a significant portion of our Trust Land funds for this purpose. We are committed to do all we can to keep our class sizes as low as possible at Foothill.

Thank you for all of your support to Foothill. There is no way we could do the great things at our school without our wonderful PTA and parent support. Thank you!

MORE **NEWS**

NURSING NEWS

This winter there has been a fairly large number of students slipping on ice and snow and injuring their heads.

A head injury is any physical harm to the scalp, skull, or brain. Head injuries are very common and usually are not serious. They can be EXTERNAL or INTERNAL.

EXTERNAL head injuries are injuries to the scalp. These injuries often look serious because the scalp has many blood vessels that can bleed, sometimes causing a big lump or "goose egg" that can take days or weeks to disappear.

Applying an ice pack or instant cold pack wrapped in a washcloth or towel to the injured area for up to 20 minutes every 3-4 hours for the first 1-2 days can help ease swelling.

INTERNAL head injuries may involve the skull, blood vessels inside the skull, or the brain itself.

A CONCUSSION is a type of internal head injury. In a concussion, a person temporarily loses brain function. Someone may have a concussion even when there's no obvious wound or unconsciousness. After a concussion, the brain needs time to heal. Recovery will depend on how long the symptoms last. It's very important to wait until all symptoms have ended before resuming normal activities.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS CAN PREVENT HEAD INJURIES!

Please remind your children to not run across any area that has snow or ice. Also, please make sure your children wear boots or shoes with good traction to help prevent slipping on snow and ice.

Both children and adults should wear helmets, safety gear, and seatbelts whenever appropriate!

Schools and/or public citizens are invited to nominate individuals in any of the four categories: teacher, administrator, volunteer, or special education teacher. Single nominations only – teaching/volunteer team nomination will not be accepted. Incomplete, excessive, or duplicate applications will be disqualified. Previous winners are not eligible. Nominations cannot be made by immediate family or by self. All applicants must use the approved nomination form. Any modified forms will result in disqualification. **The Huntsman Awards Committee highly recommends people whose nominees do not win in a given year to re-submit.** All public schools and districts throughout Utah that are funded by state taxes are invited to participate. If you have any questions, please call The Huntsman Awards for Excellence in Education at 801-584-5799.

- **TEACHER:** This category is open to any full-time, certified Utah public school teacher (elementary, middle school, high school) whose major responsibility is the direct instruction of students and who has completed a minimum of <u>five</u> years teaching experience with satisfactory evaluations.
- **ADMINISTATOR:** This category is open to the nomination of any on-site, practicing principal, or counselor of a public elementary, middle or high school, who has completed a minimum of <u>five</u> years of service as an administrator with satisfactory evaluations.
- **VOLUNTEER:** Any volunteer who has direct involvement with children in the classroom of a public school without pay on a regular basis for at least two full years may be nominated in this category. (Example: Retired individuals who dedicate their time, talents, and skills to further enhance students' learning experience.)
- **SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHER:** Nominations are open to any full-time, certified, Utah public school teacher who has worked exclusively in a self-contained special education classroom in an elementary, junior high, or high school, for a minimum of <u>five</u> years with satisfactory evaluations.

Please complete Sections 1, 2, and 3 of the nomination form.

You must also attach <u>**TWO**</u> supporting pages explaining why you believe the nominee deserves this award. Please give specific examples of unique contributions the nominee has made and how he/she exemplifies excellence by having a direct impact on the lives and education of public school children. Explain the nominee's experience within the professional field and what he/she is doing to enhance student academic achievement. Please include comments from supervisors, peers, parents, and students, and provide pertinent details about the school and classroom structure, including the number of students enrolled.

These two pages should be typed (8.5" x 11", single sided, Times New Roman font size 12, 1" margins, and staple) to the nomination form.

Please do not submit any pictures or newspaper articles. Binders, covers, or folders will not be accepted.

Nominations will be accepted in our office until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, March 25, 2016.

Eleven winners will be selected to receive this Award in recognition of outstanding contributions to our public school system and receive \$10,000 each, donated by Jon M. Huntsman and family.

Awards are given to two teachers and one administrator from elementary, middle and high schools, one volunteer, and one special education teacher.

Winners will be announced approximately sixty days later.
