From the Principal...

Safety of our students is of great importance to us. Please help us with this concern by following these rules of safety:

- Use the drop off/drive through lanes properly.
- Never park and leave your car unattended in the drop off/drive through lanes.
- ALWAYS walk your child through the crosswalk to the sidewalk if you park in the lot.
- Never drive, park or walk through the bus zone. This applies to Kindergarten parents, too. There are aides stationed at the flag pole and in the kindergarten yard to assure your child's safety.
- When you are picking up your child, please be patient and pull into the drive through, do not pick your child up on the street.
- Remind your child to follow all safety rules at school:
  - When coming to or leaving school
  - On the playground
  - In the halls or in class

Taking a little extra time to follow these procedures may seem burdensome at times but as we all work together to follow them they will become good habits that will become second nature.

Attendance, every day, is crucial for children to get the most out of school. Of course, illness and other things require absences occasionally and we understand this. However, when a child is absent from class they miss important instruction which cannot be replicated. Even though they can do the homework for the lessons they missed, it is not a substitute for the actual instruction.

If your child does need to be absent, please remember to contact the office so the absence may be excused.

Student information that is updated and accurate is vital for the school to have in case of emergency. You may have done some of the steps of the update, such as internet permission and media release, but if you have not updated emergency information please do that now.
