As the weather begins to warm up there will be many more activities that pull on our time. Soccer and baseball teams will be organized, and kids will be playing outside more. After a long cold winter these are great activities. As we start participating outdoors more I ask that we stay committed to reading every day. According to Richard C. Anderson of the Center for Reading, University of Illinois, reading has a direct correlation on the students' rank on standardized testing. He conducted a research study involving 155 fifth graders. The following chart is a sampling from Mr. Anderson's research. This chart shows a direct correlation between the amount of time spent reading and reading achievement of Fifth Graders.
