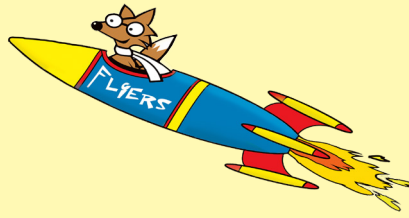

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to another year of school. This summer our teachers have been in the building working hard to prepare for a fantastic school year. Many of our teachers have worked together as teams to better align their curriculum. They are excited to welcome your children into their rooms and to challenge and teach them new concepts. Our teachers love your students and welcome the opportunity to work with both you and your child.

We have worked hard this summer to prepare for a great year, but we also need help. A few tips to help your child have greater success in school are:

- Take a few moments each day and ask your child how their day went.
- Ask what homework they may have.
- Set a designated time and place for homework.
- Take the time to help your child with their homework.
- Encourage your child to read every night.
- Let your child see you reading everyday.

If you are driving your children to school we have a few safety rules that help to make our school a safer place to be. Our student drop off is at the front of the school. This area is designated for parents to circle, stop, and drop off/pick up their children. There are two lanes. The inside lane is for drop off/pick up, and the outside lane is for passing. We also ask that all adults use the crosswalk as well. This helps to teach our children safety habits as well as provide for your own safety.

For those who need to drop off their kids and assist them into the school please park in the parking lot and walk with your child. If you are using this option we ask that you accompany your child to the school using the crosswalks. Children should never use the drop-off crosswalk alone. Do not park in the parking lot and have your child walk through the lot without you.

Safety tips for children being dropped off by car

- Wait for the car to come to a complete stop before attempting to load or unload.
- Enter and exit your parent's car from the sidewalk side, never from the street side of the car.
- Wait for your parent's car to come to a complete stop.
- Do not run on the sidewalk next to the cars.


Safety tips for children near buses

- When you get off, take five giant steps away from the bus, out of the danger zone.
- Cross in front of the bus, and make sure you maintain eye contact with the driver.
- Never go back for anything and never bend down near or under the bus.

Safety tips for parents

- Do not use your cell phones in the drop off/pick up zone. This is a distraction drivers do not need while picking up children.
- A child's safety is far more important than saving a few seconds.
- Watch for children. They are small and easily can be hidden in the blind spot.
- Only drop your kids off when your car arrives at the designated yellow painted drop off zone.
- Encourage them to sit quietly in their seat and follow the bus driver's instructions.
- Never drop or pick up your child in the Fox Hollow bus zone or parking lot next to it.
