 - Do we have coaches?: yes, literacy targets and coaches will be coming in to show us data about this (issues with social/emotional, learning loss from COVID, etc.)
 - Mental health are we doing a better job using Mr. Torkornoo than his other school, or do we actually have more need? Answer: We are being proactive with using Mr. T, and will also be using new Social Worker Lisa Cummings. We have support and need, also getting to keep nurse two days per week instead of one. There is a labor shortage, hard getting people to apply for guidance, social workers, and psychologists. Does this have to be paid by the District, or can the SCC budget work with funding? Cost is too high. Best measure is to get bond measures and to talk to the school board. Teacher mental health what can parents do to help with teachers struggling? Somewhere in the school they can go? Would probably be a waste on money. Jeanette a huge issue is class sizes, it makes mental well-being hard to manage. Do we have anything we can do? District makes the decision using a formula, and there is a limited amount of FTE's.
 - Traffic Safety Concerns what are school's thoughts? Lehi City Police (Officer Lucas C. Miller) is coming on Friday to talk about the problems with the intersection 3200 traffic. Parents are as much of a problem as kids with safety issues. Part of the issue is all students on the same schedule instead of staggered/tracks. Police may issue citations, cones, and other things to help combat traffic problems. Can we get a crossing guard on the other side of the road at 3200.
 - Role or relationship with church across the street? Last year when we had the evacuation drill, they were hesitant to allow us to use the parking lot when parents were accessing the building to pick up their children. We can look into speaking with them again. Look into other places we can use for parking for big events.
