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Principal's News

Dear Parents.

With the onset of winter, cold weather is sure to be ever present. To be comfortable in the cold, one must be prepared. At Harvest we ask that you help your children enjoy the cold while they are outside for recess time. Recess is a necessary and important diversion for children during their day at school. In order to enjoy their time outside students need to come to school with sufficient clothing to keep them warm outside.

Too many children come to school with inadequate attire to spend time in our winter weather. Cold weather gear is critical for your children to be happy while they spend time outside. Students very much regret being held in class during recess time. Our students will only be kept inside for the following reasons:

- ►The temperature is below 20 degrees with wind-chill.
- ► The precipitation is such that a child would remain wet for long periods of time after being outside.
- ►The wind is excessively strong.
- ►The air quality is determined to be unhealthy.

Children are expected to dress appropriately for the weather. In the wintry weather, parents should dress children in cold-weather gear including coats, hats, and gloves. We invite and encourage you to label all clothing items and check the lost and found often. When there is a slight drizzle, children would be expected to wear waterproof jackets or to use an umbrella.

There may be children with asthma or other medical conditions that would necessitate their remaining inside. Parents may write a note to teachers allowing them to quietly stay in the north hallway close to the west doors.

This time of year also brings more cars to our school. Courteous, careful and slow driving cannot be emphasized enough when loading and unloading students. Do not drive faster than 5 miles per hour through the parking lot. On bad weather days, traffic jams occur. Anticipate this problem by allowing enough time to remain safe when picking up students. Since children are not always careful, adults must drive safely. Parents who are busy on their cell phones in the pick up/drop off areas greatly increase the possibility of injuring a child including their own. If you are unable to do a quick drop off, please use the parking lot so that the traffic flow can remain as smooth as possible. If you feel it is necessary to keep an eye on your child, please go to the parking lot.

We would also request that you prearrange with your children for after-school pick up. If you have prearranged to have your children walk but you want to pick them up please layout a plan for them to know where you would pick them up so we do not have a "traffic jam" of our own in the office of children trying to call home.

We appreciate your support in helping us keep your children safe, happy and warm in order to provide an excellent educational experience at Harvest Elementary. We wish you all a very safe and happy holiday season.
