# WHAT TO EXPECT IN A LANGUAGE IMMERSION PROGRAM

Dual immersion offers a rich bilingual experience for young learners when their minds are developmentally best able to acquire a second language.

Instruction is divided between two high quality, creative classrooms: one English and one in the target language. Students enjoy the advantages of two caring, qualified teachers.

The English-speaking teacher uses half of the instruction time to teach primarily English Language Arts. The teacher of the target language uses the other half of the day to teach other core curriculum, including literacy in the target language.

The language teacher speaks only in the target language and communicates using a range of engaging strategies including pictures, songs, games, body language, expressions, pantomime, drama, etc.

### HOW TO ENROLL YOUR CHILD

- Where possible, attend a Language Immersion Parent Information Open House held at an Immersion school (January-February)
- 2. Submit an application by the school's deadline (available at the Information Open House, or the school's front office or website)
- 3. The school will notify parents (early Spring) if their child is selected for admission. Parent Commitment and Registration Forms to confirm participation must be completed and returned by the school's deadline.
