## **Principal's News**

Dear Parents.

Parent Teacher Conferences are right around the corner. They will occur on February 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. We hope you will make appointments online to visit with your child's teacher. The window for parents to access the Online Scheduler opens on January 7<sup>th</sup> and is open until January 18<sup>th</sup>. You can access the online scheduler by going to our website:

http://harvest.alpineschools.org then looking under the Parents/Students dropdown menu for the Online Scheduler.

You should also get a report card or a progress report close to or at your Parent-Teacher Conference. Sometimes your student doesn't do as well as we would all want them to do. A disappointing report card at mid-year is worrisome. It means your child might not be learning necessary skills. If you believe he or she can do better, you must take action.

Here is what experts suggest in order to react well to a poor report card:

• Pinpoint the problem. Has your child been absent too much to learn? Does he/she turn in homework on time? Does he/she have attention or behavior problems?

• Talk with your child. What is causing him/her to struggle in school? What would help him/her? It's okay if he/she isn't sure.

 Share your expectations. Explain that you take low grades seriously. Your child doesn't have to get all A's, but he/she does need to try hard and ask for help when he/she doesn't understand something.

• Contact the teacher. How can you solve the problem together, especially now at Parent-Teacher Conferences? • Plan for Improvement. Set a

realistic goal in one or more areas (such as turning a C into a B- or doing homework at a regular time).

 Praise your child's success. Notice where he/she does well, including in extracurricular activities, and give frequent compliments.

It is my hope this conference time with teachers will be very productive for you and your student.

I want to give a quick reminder about our Rosetta Stone Program to make sure you know that all accounts are active. If you have not been able to access your account, please call the office and let us help you gain access and start your language learning experience.

We have been having success with our Double Dosing for students who have been invited to participate. I am concerned that some are refusing to send their students for the week to get additional instruction in very specific areas identified to help your student. If you receive an invitation to participate in the Double Dosing, please give permission for your child to attend. This is targeted instruction specifically diagnosed for your child to fill in gaps of learning so they can succeed.

Thanks for all the great things you do for your children to help them be the best they can be and for all you do for Harvest Elementary School. It is such a pleasure to be a part of this great place.

It is very important that you sign up for your time through the Online Scheduler during the open window (January 7<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup>)

You should have received a letter this week from your teacher explaining how to schedule your appointment. If you have any further questions please feel free to contact the office. If you do not schedule your time during the open window (JAN 7<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup>) then you will need to contact the teacher directly. It is much more convenient to use the online scheduler. If you do not have access to a computer at home the office will make one available to you. The office hours are 8:00-4:00.

## Kindergarten Pre-Registration

If you have a child starting Kindergarten this fall, registration at Harvest Elementary will be held in the gym on Tuesday, February 7<sup>th</sup> as follows:

Last Name A-D 9:30 -- 10:30am

Last Name E-J 10:45am -- 11:45am Last Name K-R 1:00pm -- 2:00pm Last Name S-Z 2:15pm -- 3:15pm

**REGISTRATION:** To register a child for Kindergarten, your child must be 5 on or before Sept 1, 2012. If you would like to get a head start on filling out the paperwork at home, you may pick up a packet at the office on Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> between 8:00 - 3:30. Please return the packet during registration on February 7<sup>th</sup>.

**BIRTH CERTIFICATE/IMMUNIZATIONS:** For those students attending Harvest next year, your child will be assigned a teacher and track and posted in August along with grades 1-6 if your registration packet is complete. "COMPLETE" packet means that all paperwork must be finished including a copy of the official birth certificate (no cards accepted), immunization records (or exemption form), and proof of residency. Please have the pink immunization form filled out. We need both the pink card and the copy of the immunization form. Also the guardianship status form needs to be complete along with required documentation if applicable. A copy of the birth certificate, immunization records, proof of residency and court documentation may be made at the school on the day of registration.

Most children are in need of additional immunizations. These immunizations may be completed during the summer and an updated immunization record must be submitted to the office by August 1<sup>st</sup>. All shots required by Utah State Law must be completed before a child attends school.
