Introduction

Harvest Elementary was established as a Professional Learning Community in the Fall of 2006. Since that time, we have worked closely with parents, students and the community to establish a positive learning environment with high expectations for all. We have high expectations for our students, parents, staff and faculty. Student achievement is our focus.

Achievements

We score above district average in Language Arts, Math, and Science in our state criterion-referenced tests. Our goals are to improve student learning in all areas, specifically to increase the percentage of students who show mastery on the CRT by 3%.

The Utah State Office of Education released accountability data for Adequate Yearly Progress. We are pleased to report that Harvest Elementary School received a Yes on the U-PASS School Report Card and met all 40 of the 40 AYP criteria this past year.

School Community Council


Our School Community Council consists of school representatives and an elected group of dedicated parents whose purpose is:

PTA and Volunteers

Student achievement is enhanced as we invite parents to be active participants within the walls of the school. Our Parent Teacher Association organizes volunteers as helpers to read with and tutor children each week. We create an inviting atmosphere where parents feel welcome in our school. At Harvest, we average over 20 volunteer hours per day. Community members also come to provide a service to our school by giving cultural presentations to our students.



Take Home Reading Library

Many volunteers come on a daily basis to care for and manage our Take Home Reading Library. Each child receives a different leveled reader on a daily basis to improve literacy skills.

Offerings

Our priority is to offer all students individualized access to high academic standards as well as in the arts. These include specialized instruction in Art in all its aspects and media. Students are learning music theory and history and are invited to join the school choir and orchestra. Students learn to use technology to prepare for the challenges the future will bring. In our Physical Education classes, students learn to develop healthy lifestyles through fitness and knowledge.

Spanish Immersion

Our Dual Spanish Immersion students are challenged to learn a second language in addition to all other subjects. Acquiring a second language prepares students to better function in a culturally diverse world. We currently have Spanish Immersion classes in grades 1 through 6 and will add 6th grade in the next year.
