Dear Parents.

During this month we will be having a general parent meeting to introduce the new Utah State Core in English Language Art and Math and to have conversations and feedback about its implementation. I invite you to a meeting on Thursday March 22nd, 2012 at 6:00 P.M. to be held in the gym area of our school.

The English Language Arts Core Standards will change, and the ultimate goal of the change is to ensure textbooks and offering feedback on the that all students are career and college-ready. To accomplish this, the new Utah Core Standards emphasize foundational skills in reading, writing, and communicating. Parents should see increased rigor at all levels and focus on creativity and critical thinking skills.

One of the major changes we will see in the teaching of elementary mathematics with the implementation of the New Utah Core is that some current core concepts will be eliminated in an effort to go deeper

with other concepts. Emphasis is placed on making both understanding of concepts and procedures for solving problems important. Students who understand a concept are defined as students who are able to make sense of the problem situations, can use a variety of strategies including the traditional algorithm, can incorporate argument into proving their solutions, and make connections between current concepts and those previously taught.

We will also be viewing new math selection of a math textbook for our school from a selected recommendation of two different texts. I invite you to come and be informed about the new Utah State Core that the Utah State Board of Education voted to adopt in the summer of 2010.

I look forward to seeing you then.
