## Did You Know?

\* Hidden Hollow earned a "B" grade as part of the state's UCAS report following spring 2015 S.A.G.E. testing. This is our second year administering the SAGE test, and the "percent proficient" for students **increased in all three academic areas!** Way to go!

\* Hidden Hollow is in its 8th year. Enrollment 887.

\* We are a partnership school with the Utah Valley University School of Education. Two UVU interns currently teach at HH.

\* Hidden Hollow employs 39 teachers (36 women and 3 men) and an additional 21 staff members.

\* We host 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> grade Accelerated Learning Lab (A.L.L.) classes for gifted students.

\* The HH Running Club continues this year with tremendous parent/teacher volunteers.

\* The Road to Success Reading Incentive Program is in its third year. Last year, students exceeded their goal by reading over 2 million minutes!

\* The Robotics program continues

\* Following last year's successful production of The Jungle Book, HH students will be performing Alice in Wonderland in spring 2016.

\* This is our second year hosting a tuition-paying preschool.

## School Trust Lands

The School Trust Lands Administration has the responsibility to generate funds for Utah's public schools from public lands that are held in trust by the state. Hidden Hollow received over \$55,000 for 2014-2015. After gathering input from patrons and teachers, the School Community Council determined how to best use these funds to support academic needs at Hidden Hollow.

### ***With those funds and as part of the School Improvement Plan:***

- \* 72 Chromebooks and two carts were purchased, which allowed one roaming cart of 35 chromebooks to be available for each grade 3-6.
- \* Mastery Connect was purchased and available for each grade K-6.
- \* Teachers were paid to collaborate for four days in the summer. They spent that time preparing to teach the common core curriculum and refining curriculum maps and common assessments.
- \* Additional titles were purchased for the Guided Reading Library.
- \* Teachers were sent to the CITES Literacy Conference in the spring. CTLs from grades K-6 also went to the Mike Mattos Conf. in the spring.
- \* Double dosing was offered in grades 1-4.
- \* We renewed many software licenses, but the school district also paid for some of those renewals.
