School Trust Lands


The School Trust Lands Administration has the responsibility to generate funds for Utah's public schools from public lands that are held in trust by the state. Hidden Hollow received approximately \$127,000 for the 2021 – 2022 school year, which includes funds carried over from the 2020-2021 school year. After gathering input from patrons and teachers, the School Community Council determined how to best use these funds to support academic needs at Hidden Hollow.

With those funds and as part of the School Improvement Plan:


