

## **Students Learning Every Day**

Every day before and after school the **Legacy Booster Club** provides additional instruction and practice for students who need extra time to learn important skills and concepts. Students receive help in specific areas in literacy and math.

**Den Time** occurs during the school day, and it creates focused instruction for every student to improve their learning through enrichment or through reteaching. These two programs are part of Legacy's pyramid of interventions and they help address student needs at specific levels.

## School Trust Land Grant 2015-2016

Utah's School Land Trust Administration awarded \$52,637 to Legacy Elementary for 2015-16. These funds are being used to meet our school goals in reading, writing and math. This includes:





LEGACY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AMERICAN FORK, UTAH, US



Students attended the 2002 Salt Lake Winter Olympics. The school made new friends when they became the cheering section for a Women's Hockey team from Kazakstan.

The dual-track extended day schedule was implemented to meet demands of increasing student enrollment. In 2005 the school moved to a Modified Extended Day model, providing small group instruction time for literacy.

Tuition preschool was established at Legacy. One year later a Special Education Preschool class was added to the program.



Booster Club provided before and after school intervention for students to receive academic help in identified areas in literacy and math. Den Time was established during the school day to create reteaching and enrichment opportunities for all students.

The Legacy Triathlon Award was established to recognize students for reading, service, and fitness. Students earn bronze, silver, and gold medals.
