What a great year we had. So much was accomplished and the students, with the help of

their teachers and the support of their parents, have reached greater heights of student achievement. We are so proud of all that was accomplished. As we are looking forward to next year, may I encourage parents to make sure your students are reading at least 20 minutes a day during the summer. Research has shown that when the formal learning process ends at the end of the school year and summer vacation begins, students who do not keep up with reading tend to slip back academically. This is known as "Summer Slide," which sounds like something fun but the reality is when students "slide" back from what they learned during the year. This makes it harder for them at the beginning of the school year and much time and effort is wasted on re-teaching. Reading during the summer has proven to reduce the degree of "Summer Slide" and has fostered student achievement.

So, have a great summer and enjoy all the fun things that summer brings, but make sure the kiddo are reading for 20+ minutes a day. It will pay big dividends.
