

Community Council

Open to everyone, the Lehi Elementary Community Council is an advisory body. Our school receives an annual dividend from the School LAND Trust Program and the council reviews and prepares plans for this and other academic improvements for our students each year (all plans are reviewed by the school board). The council will meet Thursday, February 20th at 3:30pm at school.

Have you tasted the air lately? Then you know we all need to do our part to help cut down on emissions. We would like your help to reduce idling. Did you know that if everyone in the United States stopped idling for five minutes a day it would be equivalent to taking five hundred thousand cars off the road and saving one point six million tons of CO2? By turning your engine off when parked for more than 10 seconds, you will save money by reducing fuel use. You will breathe easier by preventing unhealthy exhaust from building up in and around your car, and you will protect the blue sky by reducing idling emissions that contribute to smog, because 10 seconds of idling uses more fuel than restarting your engine. Classroom Volunteers

Volunteering in your child's class is fun and rewarding ... and it gives great benefits to our school!

One-on-one help with reading and math for students moves everyone forward, and helps give individual attention and while not taking teachers away from the rest of the class. You can volunteer as little as 30 minutes a week! Just talk to your student's teacher ... they would love the help!

Do you have a child going into **kindergarten** in the fall? To register them, you will need to have a copy of their birth certificate and have their vaccinations up-to-date. The Utah County Health Department (UCHD) can help! Copies of birth certificates can be obtained in American Fork (599 South 500 East) or Provo (151 South University Ave). The UCHD can also look up vaccination records (medical provider participation required). If you need immunizations, they provide all childhood vaccinations (including Kindergarten and 7th grade boosters). Most insurances are accepted, and they offer low cost Vaccine for Children (VFC) Program vaccines (availability based on income). Details available at www.UtahCountyHealth.org.
