Isn't it amazing that September has come and gone and Fall is upon us. Since the last newsletter there as been some great things happening here at the Home of the Lions.




We had our first Munch and Mingle and were excited to see so many parents come and enjoy lunch with there kiddos.

Halloween Parade & Costume Policy

The Halloween Parade will be on Friday the 31st at 9:30 AM. Parent can enjoy the parade in the gym or lunch room. Please enter the building by the lunchroom by the ramp. Costumes must be G rated. No facial masks. The costumes must meet district dress policy. No bare tummies or spaghetti straps. Students should be able to work in their seat while wearing the costume. So no hoop skirts or boxes around them. There are NO weapons allowed of any kind. No guns for cowboys or swords or even brooms for witches. Nothing that could be used as a weapon. Students are not allowed out of class to put on face paint or to put on costumes.

How important is school attendance?

The attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent. In addition to falling behind in academics, students who are not in school on a regular basis are more likely to get into trouble with the law and cause problems in their communities. A 2008 study conducted by the Rodel Community Scholars at Arizona State University that tracked students from kindergarten through high school found that dropout patterns were linked with poor attendance, beginning in kindergarten. Gregory Hickman, director of the Rodel Community Scholars program and former director of the Arizona Dropout Initiative, notes they discovered that as early as kindergarten, behavioral differences are

apparent between those who go on to graduate and those who drop out, with dropouts missing an average of 124 days by eighth
