Halloween Safety

Children love Halloween; they get to dress up and eat candy. What else could a child ask for in a holiday? Although it's fun, there are some common sense tips to keep your children safe during this yearly tradition.



- Get on the internet and check the local state website sex offender registry list. The state
 of Utab has a list of offenders by zip code. Make sure that your children stay away from these houses.
- Know the route your children will be taking if you aren't going Trick-or-Treating with them and check in with them periodically.
- Know what other activities a child may be attending, such as parties, school or mall functions. If they
 are going to be at a friend's home, get the phone number and make sure that you've met the parents.
- Help your young child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make sure that it's fire proof or treated with fire retardant. If they are wearing a mask of any kind, make sure that the eye holes are large enough for good peripheral vision.
- Explain to children of all ages that vandalism and animal cruelty are not acceptable Halloween
 activities and can be punishable by law.
- · Make sure to check your children's candy before they dig in.
- Teach your kids about not getting into cars with strangers or talking to those they don't know even
 if they seem friendly, ask for help, or know the child's name. They should never go into the house of a
 person they don't know. Also, tell them what they should do if a stranger takes them- scream as
 loud as possible to attract attention and to run away as fast as they can to someplace safe.
- Be sure your children know how to cross the street properly.
