
PACE & SCHOOL GRADE

The Governor's "On PACE 66% by 2020" initiative seeks to increase the state's educational performance to reach the 66 percent benchmark. The vision is that at least two-thirds of Utahns ages 20 to 64 will have earned a postsecondary degree or certificate.

The "PACE" acronym represents initiatives to achieve the following by 2020:

- Prepare young learners
- Access for all students
- Complete certificates and degrees
- Economic alignment

The PACE initiative provides a variety of data points for schools in the form of a school report card which includes a summary of the points earned by the school to determine their school grade. See Lindon's performance below:



2015 SAGE COMPARISON TO DISTRICT AND STATE



SAGE is a system of assessments designed to measure student success and growth over the years. SAGE tests are based on the Utah Core Standards, a set of academic standards that raise our expectations for students and teachers. 3rd-6th grade students took them for the first time in the spring of 2014.

SAGE assessments are unique to Utah.

They were developed specifically for Utah students according to a rigorous and inclusive test development process. This process included the following:

- Development workshops involving Utah teachers and numerous reviews by the Utah State Office of Education (USOE),
- · Test development experts,
- Utah educators and citizens, and \boldsymbol{a}
- Parent test review committee composed of Utah parents.


Lindon 4th graders scored 18% HIGHER than the state average on the SAGE test for Science! Lindon students improved from 48% proficient to 56% proficient on the SAGE test for Math!

SCHOOL LAND TRUST PROGRAM AND SCC

The School LAND Trust program brings tens of millions of dollars annually to academic programs in public schools across Utah. Each school elects a school community council consisting of parents, teachers, and the principal.

School Community Councils carefully study their school test scores, decide which areas they want to improve, and develop a School Improvement Plan. From that plan, a council chooses one or more academic areas on which to focus its annual trust dividend from the School LAND Trust program to improve student performance.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT LITERACY GOALS 2015

Goal #1: 80% of Kindergarten-3rd grade students will demonstrate proficiency in reading by reaching grade level benchmarks on the Spring Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA).

Results: 73% of our K-3 students met Spring 2015 DRA Benchmarks. K=78%; 1st=66%; 2nd=76%; 3rd=86%

Goal #2: 3rd-6th grade students who scored in the proficient range (3s and 4s) on the 2014 Language Arts SAGE Assessment will maintain their scores in a proficient range and also have an SGP of 40 or higher on the 2015 Language Arts SAGE Assessment.

Results: 80% of those students had an SGP of 40 or higher! In fact, almost 50% of the 31 students who did not have an SGP of 40 were VERY close with SGPs in the 30 range.

Goal #3: 3rd-6th grade students who scored in the below proficient range (1s and 2s) on 2014 Language Arts SAGE Assessment will have an SGP of 40 or higher on the 2015 Language Arts SAGE Assessment.

Results: 60% had an SGP of 40 or higher. 23 students with an SGP between 80-99 which represents over two years of growth!
