2011 - 2012 SCHOOL TRUST LAND PLAN

Our school Trust land plan and goal is to continue to maintain or increase the number of students who score at proficiency levels (3 and 4) as reported on the CRT assessment in both language arts and math in grades fourth through sixth. This would be evident by the school achieving a state UPASS progress point score of 190 or more.

We also want to improve proficiency levels, throughout the year, as reflected with DRA assessments. This would be illustrated by a 10 percent increase in proficiency levels in grades second through third and a 5 percent proficiency increase in grades fourth through sixth. This goal will be supported by the use of "Double Dosing" in grades first through sixth and our Reading Recovery efforts for students in first grade.

To help us achieve these goals, 2011-12 Trust land funds will be used to hire teacher assistants that will assist regular classroom teachers in providing more individual help for students. Teacher professional development opportunities will also be funded.

DOUBLE DOSING

Our school is participating in a student remedial program known as "Double Dosing." This program focuses on re-teaching reading, writing, and math strategies for struggling students in grades 1-6. Students targeted for this program are those who are just below grade level and our goal is to provide assistance for these students before they fall too far behind.

Under the direction of grade level coordinators, para professionals work with groups of students from each grade three times a week. The program is fluid and a student's participation time is based on his/her improvement. Student's attendance, behavior, and progress are monitored on a daily basis.

During teacher collaboration time on Monday six to eight students, from each grade level, are identified by teachers that could benefit from this program. Teachers then discuss strategies and ideas for both pre-teaching and re-teaching and then provide the necessary materials for para professionals to use with these students.

BULLY BLOCKER PROGRAM

This year our school is implementing an anti-bullying program, called "Bully Blockers". We believe that bullying of any kind is unacceptable. Students should be free from worries about being bullied in any kind of environment – home, school, neighborhood, recreational facilities, etc. Also, students who bully others must be taught other, appropriate ways of interacting with peers as well as different skills and tools they can use to prevent or respond to bullying.

As you know, bullying can take different forms, such as physical or verbal, and it can harm victims' social relationships with their peers. Bullying is hurtful to students who are the targets of bullying as well as to students who witness bullying.

Our anti-bullying goals this year are to create a positive school setting, increase awareness about bullying among all educators, staff, and students; enforce school anti-bullying rules; provide enhanced supervision in bully-prone locations; and teach students skills to deal with bullying, problem solving, and making friends.






MOUNT MAHOGANY DATA
