### Principal's Message

November/December 2013

#### 2013-14 School Trust land Plan

Our 2013-14 School trust land plan is based on three specific reading and language arts goals. Our first goal is to increase Direct Reading Assessment (DRA) proficiency levels by 7 - 10% for students in grades first through third from fall 2013 to spring 2014. To help achieve this goal the need for additional one-on-one learning opportunities for students is required. Teaching assistants have been hired to work with students in small groups.

Our second goal is to Increase Student Growth Percentages (SGP) in language arts for students in grades third through sixth from 40 to 45. To help reach this goal teaching assistants, under the direction of the regular classroom teacher, will use "Double Dosing" strategies to assist students who score below proficiency levels.

Also, to enhance our teaching assistants instructional skills, in-service was provided for them before school started in August.

Our third goal is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers as related to reading and language arts. Four teachers will be given the opportunity to attend the CITES conference this spring. The conference will provide opportunities for these teachers to enhance their reading and language arts instructional skills. All teachers will also have the opportunity to participate in other professional development activities throughout the year.

### 2012-13 Spring Test Results

Our CRT proficiency percentages from 2012-13 for students in grades 3 – 6 were: (1) language arts 76%, (2) math 78%, and (3) science 73%. From the previous year, our overall percentage in language arts increased from 73% to 75%, math increased from 73% to 78% and science remained at 73%.

We were also extremely pleased to see an increase of 24% in our 5<sup>th</sup> grade DWA proficiency percentage from the previous year. Also, our overall UCASS score increased from 387 points in the spring of 2012 to 414 points in the spring of 2013.

There were also increases in DRA benchmark percentages. First grade increased from 60% in the fall to 75% in the spring, second grade increased from 52% in the fall to 78% in the spring, third grade increased from 42% in the fall to 63% in the winter, 4<sup>th</sup> grade increased from 21% in the fall to 53% in the winter, fifth grade increased from 14% in the fall to 68% in the winter and sixth grade increased from 38% in the fall to 51% in the winter.

My thanks and appreciation to our group of outstanding teachers for their persistent and continuous efforts in helping our students learn and achieve from year to year.
