TECHNOLOGY

Technology has become a major focus at Mount students. Mahogany. We have two complete computer labs for student and teacher use in addition to a "mobile to provide meaningful reading and language arts lab". Students in grades 3 - 6 have also been provided a license to utilize a common assessment program known as "Mastery Connect". This program allows teachers to develop and share assessments, access students' knowledge and receive "real time" data.

In addition to implementing technology in the classroom we currently have nine staff members who are pursuing graduate degrees with an emphasis in educational technology.

SCHOOL TRUST LAND PLAN

Our 2014-15 School Trust land plan is based on three specific reading and language arts goals. Our first goal is to increase DRA proficiency levels by 7 -10% for students in grades 1 - 3 and 10% for students in grades 4 - 6. We also want to achieve positive growth in the SAGE assessment for students in grades 3 – 6 in reading and language arts from 2014 to 2015. To help achieve this goal teaching assistants have been hired to assist teachers provide more oneon-one learning and instructional opportunities for

Our second goal is to enhance teachers' abilities instruction through the use of technology. Research has shown that, from a classroom perspective, teachers have seen technology motivate and engage students who have previously been inattentive and discouraged about reading. Technology tools, such as iPads, paired with quality teaching and professional development, have been shown to improve student achievement in reading. In August 2014, teachers in grades K - 6 received in-service training by staff members who are currently implementing technology in their language arts and reading instruction.

Our third goal is to provide professional development opportunities for teachers as related to reading and language arts. Teachers will be given the opportunity to attend the CITES conference to assist them with reading and language arts instruction. Teachers will also have the opportunity to utilize half-day subs to assist them with other professional development activities.
