



# 2019-20 Trustlands Plan

North Point Elementary School was allotted just under \$70,000 in Trustland funds for the 2019-20 school year. This is similar to our 2018-19 allotment. Last year, we focused on academic growth, and we saw large improvements in this area. The School Community Council decided to focus our 2019-20 goals on growth within literacy and math. Our current Trustland goals and how the funds are being spent are shown as follows:

## Goal # 1 (K-3 Literacy)

### Our goal is to have 80% or more of our K-3 students met proficiency on the Winter DIBELs benchmark.

#### How funds were spent to achieve goal:

- DRA assessment time for teachers
- Aides for Home Reading and Double Dose
- "Rocket Readers" Kindergarten Early Intervention program
- Summer Jump Start Program for students about to enter 1st & 2nd grades
- Chromebooks for our lower grades
- Summer Collaboration Grants for teachers
- 12 Raz Kids site licenses for 12 K-2 classrooms
- 26 mini iPads for Kindergarten

## Goal #2 (4-6 Literacy)

Our goal is to have over 60% of our 4<sup>th</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> grade students reach proficiency level in Language Art as measured by the RISE assessment.

#### How funds were spent to achieve goal:

- Literacy Conferences and Conventions
- DOUBLE DOSE aides for reading and math interventions
- Summer Collaboration Grants for teachers
- Chromebooks to use with IXL, Lexia, typing, writing and various class projects

# Goal #3 (4-6 Literacy)

Our goal is to have over 60% of our 3<sup>rd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> grade students reach proficiency level in Math as measured by the RISE assessment.

### How funds were spent to achieve goal:

• We will buy a 400 student IXL Math site license for our 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade students.
