Personal Empowerment Safety Education® r.a.d. KIDS is a great program that we teach to the 2nd and 4th grade students every year. It teaches them about safety and how to stay out of danger and what to do if they find themselves in a dangerous situation. We are in need of 1-2 more instructors for the upcoming year(s). If you find yourself in a position that you could do this, we would like to know ASAP. You will need to be trained as a certified instructor, which costs over \$400. The PTA will pay for this, however we would need a commitment of at least 2-3 years in order to feel like it was money well spent. The approximate time that you would need to put into this each year would be about 3 hours a day, every day, for the first 5 weeks of school plus some meetings/assignments ahead of time to prepare for the upcoming classes. If we are able to train 2 more instructors, we would be able to divide the daily instruction up among each of the instructors, so that it wouldn't be too time consuming on any one person.
