Dear Students, Parents and Staff,

Our theme for the year is GAME ON. It is such an appropriate theme. As we think about the importance of education in the lives of our students, and the difference we can make as we work together, I believe it is imperative we continually strive to be at the top of our games.

I love to read, but I don't always finish a book from cover to cover. This is mostly true for non-fiction. I will find useful information from many different sources of books, and then refer back to those books frequently. One of the books I have found myself referring back to on a continual basis is Mindset, by Carol Dweck. In this book she talks about the fundamental importance of learning by doing, or in learning from our mistakes, and the appropriate 'growth' mindset we must have to achieve this. I find much of her work refreshing, and see it as a missing catalyst to advancing better achievement results in our students.

Recently, a close childhood friend of mine referred me to a research project called PERTS (Project for Education Research That Scales). PERTS is an applied research center at Stanford University that partners with schools, colleges, and other organization to improve student motivation and achievement on a large scale. Their belief is that successful students must be internally motivated and resilient. Being resilient constitutes choosing to learn and to persist even when schoolwork or other situations are challenging. I feel this is a critical area of emphasis that we can work on together as parents and educators- this idea of resilient students, students that persist through challenging environments.

As part of their research, they have educational toolkits for both educators and parents. Please take the time to peruse the website at <u>https://www.mindsetkit.org</u>. The first part of change is sharing a common language to begin meaningful



dialogue I would like to start the dialogue about this topic as we begin to move forward this year. I have had such great conversations with many involved parents, and welcome these conversations even further. Please, take the time to investigate this topic and visit the website. I believe it will make a powerful impact in the lives of our students, and keep us all at the top of our games.


The theme for the 2015-2016 school year is


It's Not To Late To Sign Up
