There is a quote from an unknown source that speaks to me:

"We are so often caught up in our destination that we forget to appreciate the journey, especially the goodness of the people we meet on the way. Appreciation is a wonderful feeling, don't overlook it."

There is a focus this time of year- a focus on renewal and change. New year's resolutions and a promise of new beginnings bring a sense of hope. We are also reading a book entitled "Leader in Me" together as a school, and will be kicking that off this month. The book focuses on

Stephen Covey's "7 Habits of Highly Effective People", and incorporates these into a program for schools. This is another book that is a good starting point for discussion about the values we want to reinforce as a school. It is important to us as a school that we get your input as well. We are looking for nominations to fill the following Executive Board Positions:

President Elect(s)- would serve as president(s) 2017-2018 school year. Train to serve as president(s), assist where needed in preparation to conduct all PTA mtgs., keeps in contact with principal on a regular basis, co-signs on all PTA checks with treasurer, oversee all PTA programs and events and help board members as needed. You can serve as co-presidents, meaning you can serve with another person.

Treasurer - Responsible for all financial reports, bank records and money. Works with President to create budget for the year and gets approval from the PTA board. Responsible for writing all PTA checks.

Secretary- Takes minutes and records all business in PTA meetings, other secretarial responsibilities.

Leadership VP- Provides training to board members, oversees awards, thoughts/training at PTA meetings.

Legislative VP- Over bylaws, standing rules and awareness of important legislative issues that may affect our children.

Communication VP- Coordinates and produces newsletter, manages Facebook posts, etc.

Teacher VP- Acts as a liaison and communications link between the PTA board and the faculty.

All Executive Board members attend training as needed and requested by the State, Region, Council, and Local PTA as well as monthly Executive Board and General Board Meetings.
