SKI/SNOWBOARD SCHOOL

Even though there is not snow on the ground it is time to start thinking about ski/snowboarding lessons. The lessons will be on Mondays; January 7, 14, 28 and Feb 4. They start at 1:00 so your child(ren) will need to be checked out around 12:00. The ages are 7 for skiing and 8 for snowboard. The lessons are taught by Sundance instructors and are from beginners to advanced students. There is an hour of free ski after lessons from 3:30-4:30 and there is no organized adult supervision during this time. Students carpool to and from Sundance with parents of the kids who are taking lessons. The price will be \$170 for lessons and passes (\$40 cheaper if you have a season pass), plus rentals if you need them. This is a great opportunity for your child(ren) to learn or advance their ski/snowboarding skills.
