Message from the Principal:

This year has been fabulous! Thank you for your trust and support in Orem Elementary. As the weather gets warmers it seems that there are always a couple of issues that I see cropping up. This is just a reminder about the policies at Orem Elementary School (OES).

Review the dress code for OES. Tank tops and short shorts are inappropriate for school attire, as are flip-flops. Shoes should be conducive to playing outside. Also, extreme haircuts should be done during the summer time. I see a tendency for boys to cut their hair into mohawks (shaved on the sides and spiked in the center and back). I know that the fauxhawk hairstyle is popular right now and that is fine as long as hair is left on the sides and not shaved. Also, dying the hair with extreme coloring should not happen until summertime.

Items brought from home should be educationally oriented. I have asked that students not bring electronic games or other equipment from home because they can be a distraction to students and there is a chance they might be taken or lost. Also, some parents have asked about baseball bats or lacrosse sticks. I would ask that your student leave those at home as well. I know they are fun, but with many students on our playground it is inevitable someone will be hit. The only exception would be in the case of a teacher organizing a game and supervising the use of that equipment.

Baseballs are not to be used at school. Occasionally students will come and tell the office that their ball or shoe found their way to the roof and would like our custodian to retrieve it. Mr. Vera will go up once a week to get any stray equipment, usually on Fridays.

If your student rides a scooter to school instruct them to fold it up and take it with them to class. Folding the scooter helps keep our hallways and classrooms safer as well as prevents trip hazards. It is difficult to lock them to the bike rack and that way they will be safe. If your student rides a bike to school please instruct them to lock it up before coming into the school.
