Collaboration Presentation by 4th Grade teachers-their agenda is to 1. Begin and End on time

2. Goals are: \*be prepared\*be positive\*be focused on students. They are concentrating on keeping an eye on kids who did not pass tests at the end of last years testing. They have a math test every Friday and will get together on Monday to talk about scores.

### (from 4th grade team presentation)

They use FLEX to work with all the kids who don't pass the assessment of standards, not just the ones they are focusing on for the SCC goal.

They are working no vertical alignment with the 5th grade team, so their students will be successful in the future. Their handout had the most critical standards (Power Standards) highlighted.

In collaboration they have developed their math pacing guide, they will make changes as they teach it and see the need for revisions.

They LOVE Mastery Connect. The kids are used to being assessed often, the kids are starting to ask for help when they feel they haven't masted a concept.

THEIR REQUEST: 5th grade is assessed on writing, using Utah Write. They would like to implement it in 4th grade, so they could teach it and 5th grade could refine and fine tune the writing skills of the students. It's about \$6/student (about 85 students)

Last year our average was higher than the state average, but lower than the district average.

we don't teach math like they do in Singapore, and our kids don't like math. Teaching it wrong, strong emphasis on the textbook. We need more hands on and practical math.

This program would use robots, cover engineering concepts, mapping math concepts to what is taught in the classroom.
