

Second Grade Disclosure Document

It is exciting to begin another year of second grade. We hope that our enthusiasm and love for children will show in our teaching and cause your children to love learning and enjoy coming to school.

<u>Curriculum</u>

All subjects will be taught using the Utah State Core Standards. These can be found at <u>www.uen.org/core</u>. We will teach all of the standards. We have identified essential standards in language arts and math that we will work to ensure that every child masters during second grade. These are:

Language Arts	Math
 I can use various text features to identify the main topic and key details in an informational text. I will advance my fall reading level by at least one full grade level. I can summarize a story, after reading, using important characters, events and details in sequence. I can use a variety of strategies to decode words. I can write in different genres, using rubrics to guide my writing. I can identify and correct mistakes in my writing (punctuation, capitalization, etc.) I can use a variety of strategies to spell words correctly. 	I can read and write numbers up to four digits long. I can put three-digit numbers in order. I can add and subtract numbers up to three digits long. I can skip count by twos, fives, tens and hundreds. I can tell time to the nearest five minutes. I can solve word problems involving coins and dollars. I can measure and compare length using different units of measure. I can automatically add and subtract two one-digit numbers.

<u>Homework</u>

Beginning in September, students will be participating in "Math Wizard." The students will be able to work at their own pace to learn and memorize addition and subtraction facts. More information will be coming.

Students will be expected to read at least 20 minutes per day at home. We will be participating in our school's home reading program.
