Kindergarten: Tiffany Williams

1st Grade: Becky Conover – Thanked board for BER Training and went over the benefits and how they will pass this training on to next year's 1st grade Team. 2nd Grade will be taking BER training next year.

2nd Grade: Laura Giles- Shared that weekly collaboration and Double Dose has helped

improved student's progress 3rd Grade: Bridgette Funk 4th Grade: Cassi Rindlisbacher 5th Grade: Wendy Sloan 6th Grade: Teresa Whitehead

Each grade level showed data showing students test scores from the beginning of the year, mid-year and end of year. Data showed percentage of students at benchmark, students not at benchmark, as well as year's growth. Compared OES scores to District percentages. They also shared what each grade level is doing to help student's improve.

Tim Stay said spectacular. He wants to know if kids not passing are a specific demographic or teacher. Teresa Whitehead said not kids not passing are not necessarily from any specific demographic.

Tim Stay and Sharon Faragher asked if there are additional resources that could help. Each grade said an aide would be very helpful to allow time to break into smaller groups during CUB time and in class.

Principal Park shared that she has requested a grant for \$6000 that Trustlands matches for a total of \$12000 for aides for next year.

Sharon Faragher wanted to know how aides will be divided up next year. Andrea said it is TBD. Deanne Moses inquired about parent volunteers. Discussion brought out that parent volunteering drops off about 3rd grade.

Andrea Park shared that aides will receive a 5% wage increase next year. The cost for an aide is approximately \$3000 per year for 1 hour per day.

Tim Stay says that sustained improvement each year is a sign of great planning. Everything shows that OES is doing some of the best work he has seen.

Andrea Park shared Orem Elem Essential Standards and Skills document and that Vineyard has been given a form to fill out so our teachers can know where our new Vineyard students are at. She also assured the board that all OES teachers focus 100% on all subjects regardless of specific goals set by the SCC committee. She also praised the faculty for striving for all students to reach benchmark and not the minimum goals.

Sheila Trout shared that the Trustland's balance is within about \$600 of projected balance. \$300 of the remaining funds are due to take home reading books order was given a significant discount so the amount spent of the \$1100 budgeted amount came in just over \$300 less.

Anna Steadman suggested that new council revisit goals. Sharon Faragher said we need teacher feedback to set realistic goals. Sharon asked that more teachers be in attendance at first meeting next year to talk about realistic goals.

Anna Steadman also reminded board that this is an election year for school board. Primary Election is in June. People need to be informed.

School Improvement Plan:

- 85% of the students in grades K-3 will reach the reading benchmark by the end of the year. Or demonstrate a year's growth in the 2017-2018 school year.
- Students in grades 4-6 will reach 80% proficiency on grade level math assessments or make a 25% growth during the 2017-2018 school year.
