



The charts above represent the proficiency and growth data from Pony Express. Each section is converted to a score. Proficiency was converted to 234 points and growth was converted to 150 points.

UCAS

(Utah's Comprehensive Accountability System)

UCAS was developed because of new legislation requiring schools to be graded. It is a point system based on how our students performed on the CRT assessment from the previous year.





UCAS measures Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and the Direct Writing Assessment (DWA).

Teachers attended writing seminars during the 2011-2012 school year and we invited a presenter to come to Pony Express Elementary to work with teachers and students. We were pleased to see improvement in our student's writing scores (see DWA).
