
SAGE HILLS EARNED A B grade

State testing results for 2013-14

PACE (Prepare, Access, Complete, Economic Success) is the state accountability system. Under the PACE framework, every school can earn a total of 600 points based on student achievement and student growth (300 points for achievement and 300 points for growth). Math, language arts, and science are the subject areas measured. Sage Hills earned a total of 357 points overall.





Mobile Computer Lab

This year we purchased an iPad lab and a Chromebook lab to increase our technology resources. These mobile labs move from classroom to classroom. Students are able to use these labs to do research and to access various forms of media and information. They are used for students to use Imagine Learning, Raz Kids, World Book, Utah Write, and other learning programs. These labs have been a great resource for our students as we strive to improve our reading, math, and science scores.



Double Dosing and Aides

Each grade-level team has developed a double dosing program that allows them to provide additional assistance with specific concepts. Classroom aides help facilitate student learning during the double dosing time in our 1st through 6th grades. Kindergarten teachers have created an intervention program between their morning and afternoon sessions to support students. Additional funds were allocated to provide teacher teams summer collaboration grants to plan and prepare in the areas of greatest need.



Supplies and Software

The Take Home Library is funded through our LAND Trust funds to provide necessary books, supplies, and materials for this program to function. Additional funding was allocated to support art and music programs. LAND Trust funds were also used to purchase a data assessment program which helps teachers quickly determine which students need additional support. Once these students are identified. teachers are able to focus on concepts the students are failing to understand.
