Trust Lands Report

The main function of the School Community Council (SCC) entails developing the school improvement plan, and allocating \$55,344 Trust Lands funds to support the plan. Our plan is related to our school goals of increasing our reading, writing, and math scores.

The school improvement plan for the school year focused on improving student achievement by:

-Improving student reading skills through the use of the STAR Reading Tutoring Program and our Reading For Fluency Program.

-Increasing teacher capacity and effectiveness through attending professional development. Current needs of the students and the school are met through targeted workshops, and half day extended teacher collaboration time three times a year .

-Increasing student opportunities with technology in the classroom. Overhead projectors, document cameras, computers (Chromebook & iPads), voice enhancement systems, and other technology was purchased from State Land Trust funds. 






Overall Strong Academic Tradition

Saratoga Shores Elementary has a long history of maintaining high academic standards, as indicated by our yearly state testing scores. The SAGE test is the new state assessment this year and as such fewer students will be proficient. This is not a reflection of decreased student achievement, rather, it reflects an increase in expectations. Saratoga Shores still scored well beyond State and District averages on SAGE — of particular note is our increase in student academic growth scores (see second graph below)!!
