
Students of the Month in May



Student Recognition

- Troll Spirit Sticks and Challenge Coins will reward positive behavior and motivate students.

Reducing Bullying

Bullying is a universal problem based on individuals acting on impulse and not aligning behaviors with positive values. Bullying will continue to prevail in schools and other settings as long as values of "how to behave" are not explicitly taught and reinforced on a daily bases.

Troll Patrol systematically teaches and reinforces values through assemblies, awarding troop points, troop competitions, troll to student communication, exciting books, and rewarding positive student behavior.

The Process

A value will be launched monthly at assemblies where students from Sego Lily, Freedom, and Manila create videos to teach positive behaviors that

focus on the monthly value. Troll Patrol books will also teach these same values and add an element of magic to the process.

Following the assemblies, students will return to their classes to meet as troops (North, South,


East, and West) with community members (parents, police, secondary students, and teachers) to further discuss ways they can work together to integrate the value learned at the assembly.

During the month, a friendly troll will send messages to the children, through the hollowed log to recognize positive behavior.

So FUN!!!













Healthy Hints From Nurse Bodily RN September, 2013

Let's talk about going back to school. Getting some children excited about this can be a challenge. Here are some simple tips to review with your children as they return to school. Although summer break went super fast this year, we should all be grateful for the opportunity to attend

school and gain an education.

It's school time again! You're probably feeling excited and maybe a little sad that summer is over. Some kids feel nervous or a little scared on the first day of school because of all the new things: new teachers, new friends, and maybe even a new school. When teachers do the talking on the first day, they often go over classroom rules so you'll know what's allowed and what's not. Report Card Information

Sego Lily is a great place to be. We have outstanding teachers, students and parents. Today the grade of each school in the state was reported publicly. I want to give you some information to help you understand the grading system.

We receive points for Achievement and for Growth. Achievement is based on number of students that are proficient on the State Tests. Growth is based on improved scores within a statewide cohort of scores calculated over time. It is a complex calculation.

We scored 254/300 in Achievement Points. This is 85%. This is GOOD!

We scored 194/300 in Growth Points. This is 65%. I knew this would go down from last year because we had such a tremendous growth percentile. We can work on this and make it our goal to climb back up.

Our combined score or "School Performance" score was 448/600. This is 75%. We are above state average.

In Alpine School District 11 elementary schools were graded A, 48 schools were graded B, 16 schools were graded C or below. Sego was given the grade of B.

What are our plans for improvement?

This year we are continuing RTI, Response to Intervention time, STAR reading, and Double Dosing, for re-teaching, reviewing or reinforcing key concepts in our core curriculum. This will happen before, during, and after school. It is funded with Trust Land money and District Double Dosing money. During RTI time, students that have mastered the key concept will be taught academic extensions and more advanced concepts.

In addition, Sego Lily will continue to have a summer school program. Of course the extent of that program will be based on funding.

We also will be having many opportunities for after school programs. We will continue our Technology, Fit Kids, and Robotics Clubs if available coaches will volunteer. In addition, we will add choir and golf after school programs We believe that opportunities in music, art, PE and technology also increase brainpower and this leads to expanded skills in the academic subjects. Some of our enriched programs include: Drums Alive, New Curriculum for music and PE, Science Fair, Hope of America, and the Troll Patrol Anti-bullying Program. These opportunities will be happening this year. This can be expanded if we can get some business partners.
