STANDARDS BASED REPORT CARDS ARE HERE!

The purpose of the Alpine School District standards based report card is to clearly communicate a student's current level of academic performance and progress toward mastery of grade-specific essential standards.

Essential standards are those that students must master in order to be



successful in future grade levels. We provide extra time and support for students if mastery is not achieved.

PERFORMANCE LEVEL

1 Indicates the student lacks the prerequisite skills from the previous grade to achieve the essential standards expected. Intervention is needed by teacher and school.	
2 Indicates the student demonstrates limited progress toward the essential standard. Additional support from teacher and school is needed.	
3 Demonstrates mastery and independent application of grade level essential standards. This is the desired level for all students.	
4 Indicates the student is working independently beyond grade-level concepts and skills.

WORKING COLLABORATIVELY FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

Each Monday, our teachers meet collaboratively to focus on student learning. They work in grade level teams and cross-curricular teams. In these meetings, teachers are guided by these four questions:

- 4. What will we do if they already know it?

These four questions provide a framework for analyzing data, developing learning benchmarks and implementing strategies focused on student learning. Through this process, teachers are able to identify strengths as well as areas of needed improvement.
