## **Concerning Requests**

Shelley families should have recently received track placement request forms in the mail. We will be accepting these at the front office throughout the month of March. As each is submitted, it is marked with the date and time it was turned in. The placement process can be quite a challenge as we strive to create classrooms that are as balanced as possible—in boy/girl ratios, range of academic abilities, behavior or health concerns, and number of students in a.m. and p.m. tracks. Please do not assume, if your child is on a certain track this year, that he or she will be on the same track next year. Sometimes changes have to be made to support the need to maintain these balances. It is therefore very important that we receive a track request form from every family that has a strong track need. We very much appreciate those parents who are willing to work their family schedules around the track to which they are assigned. We do try to keep all members of any given family together on the same track unless parents specifically ask us to do otherwise.

On occasion, we receive a form with a request for a certain track, a specific teacher, and the names of students who either should or should not be in the same class as the student. Please understand that a great deal of thought and consideration goes into the placement process as we try to create balanced classes at each grade level. In so doing, we are simply not able to grant every person's wishes. We ask your support and flexibility in looking for the good and the opportunity to grow in new ways as you receive your child's placement assignment for the coming school year. It will help keep balance and maximize the teacher's ability to create the most positive and effective learning environment.

## 2012/13 Student Placement Form

You should soon be receiving a white form in the mail inviting you to submit student placement information and track requests for the next school year. Please complete and return the form to our office no later than Friday, March  $30^{\text{th}}$ . These forms will be numbered in the order in which we receive them in the event we may need to move some track assignments to balance class loads as we make student placements for fall. If a certain track is essential to your family's schedule, please get your track requests in early.

In case you haven't heard, on the first Friday of each month the Shelley Elementary Box Tops Store is open for business. In order to help with the process, please take a minute and do the following before turning in your box tops:

1. Check that you have a redeemable box top (e.g. has an expiration date that is not expired) Count your box tops and try to trim any excess packaging from around the box top
Place box tops in a sealable sandwich bag
Label your bag with your name, teacher, and the total amount of box tops inside
Bring your bag to school on the first Friday of the month and wait for the store to come by your classroom

All of the steps will make the shipping process much smoother (you can imagine clipping the excess packaging from ALL the box tops collected from the whole school).

We are excited at the amount of box tops we have collected so far! One mother had the great idea of sending an e-mail message to relatives and friends inviting them to also collect box tops as well.
