#### **TESTING TIPS**

As we move into the months of April and May, a glance at the calendar reminds us we have begun the process of giving a number of end-of-year assessments such as the state SAGE testing in grades 3-6 (the testing window is March 24 through May 22), the DRA assessment in grades K-3 (April 1 through May 5), and the Kindergarten Literacy Assessment (May 5 through 16). These tests may at times be stressful to some students. This stress is not because the students don't know the information: it is because they may not be used to the testtaking format. Our teachers work very hard to prepare the students for the tests and to make testing a positive experience as a part of the students' overall learning process.

Here are four simple things parents may also do to help students do their best on these tests:

- Reassure your children that they are doing a good job at school. Self-confidence brings courage to do their best.
- Help them arrive at school *on time* every day.
- Make sure they go to bed early so that they are well rested.
- Be sure they eat a good breakfast at home or school every day.

Of course, these four practices are good not only during testing, but all the time to encourage success at school. They are especially beneficial to your children in preparation for testing time. Thank you for working with us to make school a rewarding experience for our students.
