You should soon be receiving a blue form in the mail inviting you to submit student placement information and track requests for the next school year. Please complete and return the form to our office no later than Friday, March 27th. These forms will be numbered in the order in which we receive them in the event we may need to move some track assignments to balance class loads as we make student placements for fall. The placement process can be quite a challenge as we strive to create classrooms that are as balanced as possible—in boy/girl ratios, range of academic abilities, behavior or health concerns, and number of students in a.m. and p.m. tracks. Please do not assume, if your child is on a certain track this year, that he or she will be on the same track next Sometimes changes have to be made to vear. support the need to maintain these balances. It is therefore very important that we receive a track request form from every family that has a strong track need. We very much appreciate those parents who are willing to work their family schedules around the track to which they are assigned. We do try to keep all members of any given family together on the same track unless parents specifically ask us to do otherwise. If a certain track is essential to your family's schedule, please get your track requests in early.

On occasion, we receive a form with a request for a certain track, a specific teacher, and the names of students who either should or should not be in the same class as the student. Please understand that a great deal of thought and consideration goes into the placement process as we try to create balanced classes at each grade level. In so doing, we are simply not able to grant every person's wishes. We ask for your support and flexibility in looking for the good and the opportunity to grow in new ways as you receive your child's placement assignment for the coming school year. It will help keep balance and maximize the teacher's ability to create the most positive and effective learning environment.

KINDERGARTEN NEWS

Can you believe it is March? February seems to have flown right on by. Before we know it Spring will be here! Kindergarten is a crucial year to build the foundation for learning. Here are some of the things your child has learned this year in math, reading, and writing:

Math -- In math your child has learned to write and recognize the numbers 1 - 20. Using concrete, visual props like buttons, cubes and

counting bears, your kindergartner has learned the concept of more and less, ordinal numbers, basic addition and subtraction, and how to sort using a number of different characteristics. The students have also learned how to read a calendar, name the days of the week, the months of the year and the four seasons.

Reading -- Students have learned to recognize simple words, including their own name and those of their classmates. They have learned letter-sound correspondence, phonemic awareness, sight word recognition, rhyming, word families, and concepts about print. Our kindergarten students have learned to read simple books this year and we are very proud of their progress. Please continue to have your child read to you every day for 20 minutes.

Writing -- Our Kindergarten students are writing their own stories by responding to story prompts or describing a picture. Our students are given opportunities to write in a variety of genres to help foster a love of writing. Types of writing your child has been exposed to are: narrative, informative, opinion, and writing biographies. When your Kindergartener sees himself/herself as a writer, they are more likely to practice.

Students have participated in many activities in art, music, science, social studies, physical education, health, and technology.

We want to thank you as parents for being actively involved in your child's education. Thanks for reinforcing newly learned skills as a way to promote ongoing success. Be sure to ask your child to share with you what they are learning and find ways to extend that learning.
