There are many wonderful outfits that may be great for spring and summer fun at home and in the neighborhood, but some of these outfits are not appropriate for the school environment. Please pay special

attention to guidelines about shorts, skirts, sleeveless tops and flip-flops. Thank you for helping us limit classroom distractions and ensure student comfort and safety by sending students appropriately dressed each day.

TESTING TIPS

As we move into the months of April and May, a glance at the calendar reminds us we have begun the process of giving a number of end-of-year assessments such as the state SAGE testing in grades 3-6 (the testing window is April 13 through May 21), the DRA assessment in grades K-3 (April 1 through May 5), and the Kindergarten Literacy Assessment (May 4 through 15). These tests may at times be stressful to some students. This stress is not because the students don't know the information; it is because they may not be used to the test-taking format. Our teachers work very hard to prepare the students for the tests and to make testing a positive experience as a part of the students' overall learning process.

Here are four simple things parents may also do to help students do their best on these tests:

- Reassure your children that they are doing a good job at school. Self-confidence brings courage to do their best.
- Help them arrive at school *on time* every day.
- Make sure they go to bed early so that they are well rested.
- Be sure they eat a good breakfast at home or school every day.

Of course, these four practices are good not only during testing, but all the time to encourage success at school. They are especially beneficial to your children in preparation for testing time. Thank you for working with us to make school a rewarding experience for our students.

KINDERGARTEN NEWS

We can't believe that it is April already! There are a lot of fun and exciting things coming up in Kindergarten.

We are looking forward to our field trip to Wheeler Farms on April 17th. Please sign and return your child's permission slip as soon as possible so that they may attend. If you didn't receive a note about the field trip with the attached permission slip, contact your child's teacher. Please remember that all kindergarteners will attend from 8:00 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. that day unless your child is in Mrs. Reid's OEK class in the afternoon. Coming up in April we will be working on numbers 11 and beyond. We will be learning eighteen new sight words and three word families. We will also be administering the DRA (reading assessment) test again. Please continue to read with your student as much as possible. Fluency and comprehension are what they should be working on now. Have your child read to you in a normal speaking voice and re-tell the story afterwards. What happened in the beginning, the middle, the end and who were the characters, etc. As the year starts to wind down, let's finish strong!

1ST GRADE NEWS

It is hard to believe that there are only two months of school left. The first graders are growing in their ability to read, write, and learn math strategies, as well as participate in their specialty classes.

We will be doing another round of DRA testing this month. Make sure your child is reading the Take Home Reading books each day. When finishing a book, ask your first grader to tell you who the characters were and what happened in the story. The children should be able to retell a story, naming the things that happened in the story, in the correct sequence.

Last, but not least, the boys and girls are excited to be going on a field trip to Hogle Zoo on April 17th. To go along with this, the children will be asked to write a report on an animal they are interested in. Watch for details from your child's teacher.

2ND GRADE NEWS

In the second grade, we have focused mainly on reading skills this month. We broke the students into seven groups during explorer time. Each teacher worked on different skills. We feel that we have seen a lot of improvement in the student's reading skills this year.

As a second grade we went on a field trip to see "Pinkalicious" at the SCERA Theater. Then we went to the Orem library where a wonderful storyteller and puppet master entertained us with some wonderful stories from books the students love to read. He also introduced some new books to the students that they now would like to read. He really brought the books alive for the children.

We have one more field trip coming up at the end of April. It will be to the Museum of Curiosity in Lehi. We are really looking forward to this event. This field trip also ties in with our curriculum with animals and the places that they live.
