End of Year Programs

For your planning purposes, please note that this year's Dance Festival and Field Day will again be on *two separate days* at Shelley Elementary. Our Dance Festival will be the morning of Friday, May 22, from 9:45 to 11:00 a.m. We will need ***all students*** (K-6) to plan on arriving promptly at the Track 2 start time of 9:15 a.m. Kindergarten students who remain at school after the program will be dismissed at 12:00 p.m. with the exception of the OEK students who will still stay for the afternoon. All other students will have regular work and activities in their individual classrooms for the afternoon, and will then be dismissed at 3:30 p.m.

There will be no school on Monday, May 25 in honor of Memorial Day. Then ***on Tuesday, May 26, we will have another school-wide common start day*** with students 1st-6th and all Kindergarteners coming again at the 9:15 a.m. start time. Kindergarten through 2nd grade will have their field day activities throughout the morning time. 3rd grades will be doing individual class activities for the morning. Kindergarten students will be able to visit the concession stands after their field day activities, and then will dismiss at 12:00 p.m. OEK and 1st - 6th graders will have their regular lunch and recess schedule, beginning at 11:00 a.m. Lunch served on that day will be Tuesday's pizza menu, and students will be eating outside, "picnic style". The afternoon will then be Field Day for 3rd - 5th grades. The 6th Grade will be having an end of year celebration. The OEK class and 1st and 2nd grades will hold regular school activities in their individual classrooms for the afternoon. Each class will have a scheduled time at the concessions stand as well. (The Field Day concession stands have been a long-time tradition helping each grade level earn needed funds to support class activities as well as materials and supplies for

the coming school year.) All OEK and 1st - 6th grade students will be dismissed at 3:30 p.m. A reminder letter with a more detailed schedule breakdown will be sent home with students in a week or so.

On Wednesday, May 27 there will be an Awards Assembly for 4th-6th grades at 12:30 p.m. in the gym.

Field Day

Field Day is coming up on Tuesday, May 26th. It is a day of FUN and LEARNING! Students will get to participate in several fun group games, as well as visit the concession booths. Visiting the concession booths is a terrific educational experience for students. They get to use math in a practical hands-on, real-life setting; they add and subtract money; make decisions about purchasing; and count change. The money that each grade earns from the sale of concessions goes directly to help fund valuable learning activities, particularly field trips. THANK YOU SO MUCH to all the parents who donate concessions and volunteer their time. Parent volunteers are needed to help run the concessions and field day games. A note will be sent home soon asking for volunteers, or feel free to contact your child's teacher. We certainly couldn't do it without you! :)

Last Day Schedule

8:00 – 9:30 a.m.

Friday, May 29, will be the last day of school. *All students on both Track 1 and Track 2 will come at 8:00 a.m. and be dismissed at 9:30 a.m.* If you are planning to be absent on the last day of school, please bring a self-addressed stamped envelope so we can mail home the report card and promotion slip. The Kindergarten classes last day of school will be on Thursday, May 28th at their regularly scheduled time.

Concerning Student Placements

On the last day of school included in with the report card and promotion slip, you will be notified of the *track* your child has been assigned for the coming school year. As of August 10th you will be able to log onto Skyward and see your child's *teacher* assignment. This will allow for flexibility during the summer to make final adjustments due to student move ins and move outs to keep balanced class loads.

Each grade level team has met together over the past three weeks to work carefully to achieve the best balance possible in respect to gender, track times, behavior concerns, varied academic abilities, leadership, special needs, and overall general class size. They have also tried to anticipate student combinations who might not bring out the best in each other as well as student combinations who *would* be a positive support. These grade level meetings each represent approximately four hours of serious thought, discussion, and review of student needs and concerns. **Therefore, I am asking that you accept and be supportive of the assignment your child is given.** After class placements are entered in Skyward on August 12, forms will be available for those few individuals who have major and justifiable concerns with a particular placement. After the parent completes the form, the request will be taken back to the grade level placement team involved in the initial decision, to review and reconsider. Please note that in making a change, the class balance may then be offset and additional changes may need to be made which can quickly become problematic. We hope to keep changes to a minimum, as teachers will have begun to prepare personalized student materials, etc.

With parent support in helping the students look for the good in their placement assignment and starting to anticipate and look forward to the start of the school year, you will be off to a great new beginning! Thank you.

Support for Struggling Learners

We are excited that Shelley Elementary will be receiving additional support for struggling learners in a number of ways as we look to the new school year. We will continue to have a full day of **Reading Recovery** for identified 1st grade students. Through this service, eight students each semester will be able to receive intense, daily, one-on-one interventions in reading.

This coming year we will also be continuing with our **OEK (Optional Extended Kindergarten) class** at Shelley Elementary. We currently have four regular sessions planned for this fall—two 9:15 a.m. morning sessions and two 12:40 p.m. afternoon sessions. Then we will have one additional afternoon session made up of sixteen students identified as those who most need the additional support that can be provided by having them attend a regular morning session and then stay for an afternoon of specialized instruction and support in a smaller group setting extending their Kindergarten time to a full day.

We have also been approved for district matching funds to continue our intervention plan called Explorer Time. We look forward to

continuing with this intervention time for all students during the school day next year.

We feel, with the variety of opportunities listed above, that we will be able to offer a solid and supportive learning experience for *all* students as we move forward into the new school year.

Summer Registration

Alpine School District leaders have encouraged us to have ongoing registration for new students throughout the summer months. We are designating every Wednesday morning, from 9 a.m. until noon when the office will be open for this purpose. 1ST GRADE NEWS

Take home reading will run during the summer as well. Books will be traded each Wednesday.

Raz-kids will still be available through the school website during the summer months. If you are unsure of your child's log-in information, please contact his/her teacher.

Tumblebooks is also available through the school website. This is a fun website with both fiction and non-fiction books available.

We encourage you to continue reading with your child through the summer months so they do not lose the tremendous progress they have made.

2ND GRADE NEWS

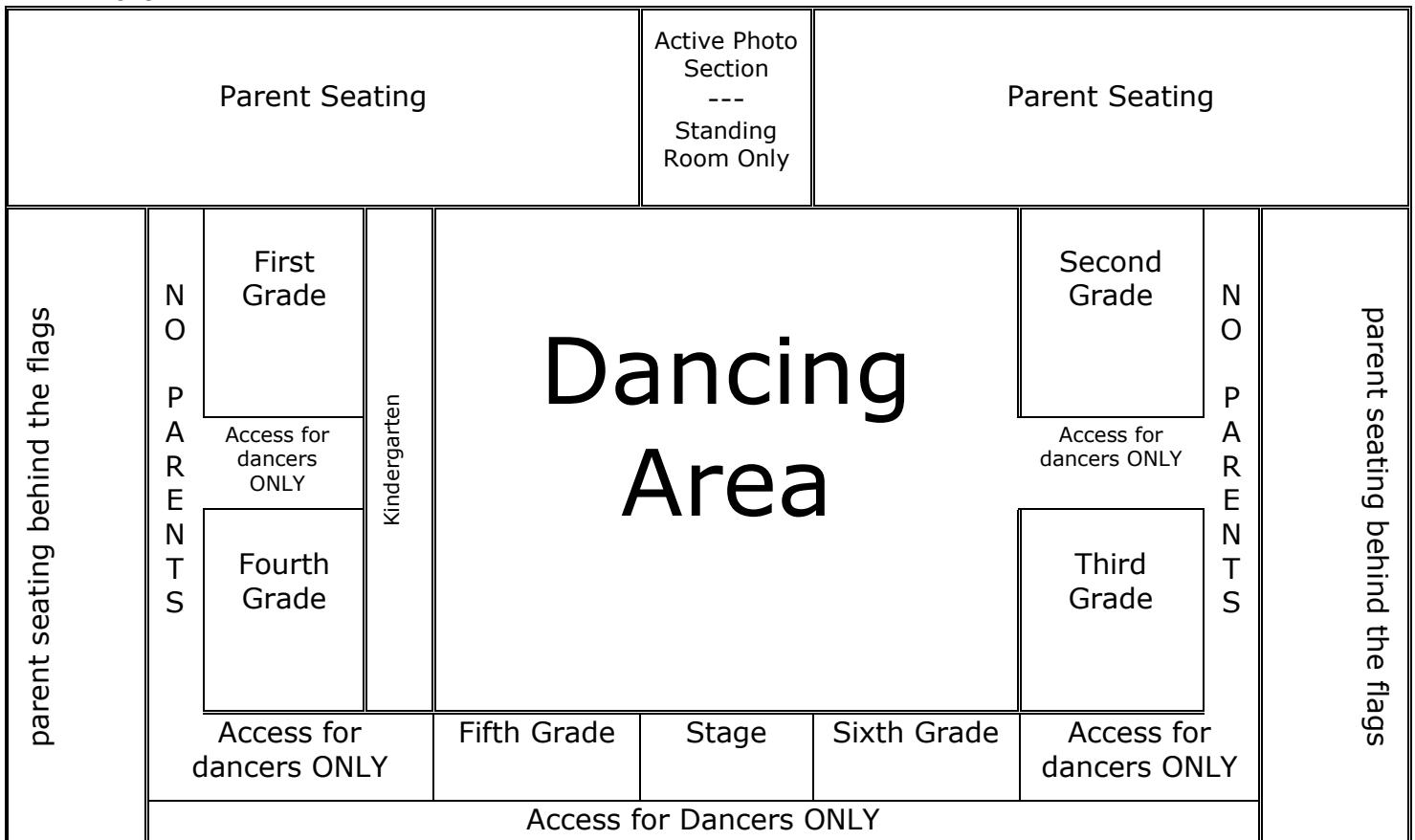

If you're someone who likes to serve, is a positive example to others, and does well in school, you may be interested in becoming a member of Shelley's Service Club.

Shelley's Service Club members lead and serve in many ways around our school. They help with morning announcements, recycling, school and PTA service projects, Back to School Night and many other activities. Volunteers take turns providing service during their lunch period. For example, Service Club members take at least one peer mediation shift per month, helping kids to resolve problems on the playground. They sell Val-o-Grams, help with the Serving with Smiles organization, collect cans for the school Food Drive, and pass out treats to kids who wear their Shelley t-shirt.

Service Club volunteers work in Shelley classrooms once or twice a week before or after school. Students are asked to be a Teacher's Assistant – helping the teacher with projects such as collating papers, putting up bulletin boards or preparing materials. They may also choose to work one-on-one with younger students in a classroom. A few of our members even help out in the office and run errands when needed.

Members of the Service Club serve between six and eight hours a month. This includes their Teacher Assistant service (1 ¼ hours per week or more), our Service Club meetings, and lunchtime activities (usually two shifts per month). Our meetings will be held next year on Tuesday afternoons from 3:30-4:00 p.m. During the year, our group has fun service celebrations, like a movie late night or a swimming party, to reward students who have met their service goals.

If this sounds like fun to you, if you feel you're the type of person we're looking for, and if you can commit to these responsibilities, complete this application and **return it to the office no later than Tuesday, May 19th**. Your parent must sign the application on the back. We will notify you of the selection outcome by Friday, May 22nd. Thank you for your interest in Shelley's Service Club.
