Without fail, in every classroom I read with, a student would raise their hand and say, "My mom told me, if you can't say anything nice, don't say anything at all." 
Thanks to the many parent volunteers that come each day, once a week, or at sometime during the school year and help out in the classroom. We appreciate you!

Anti-Bullying Poster Contest

This year at Traverse Mountain Elementary, we will be having an "Awareness Month" in October instead of just one week of Red Ribbon activities. We will focus on drug and alcohol awareness and bullying awareness. For Bully Awareness Week, we would like students to participate in an anti-bullying poster contest so we can display their posters as we learn more about bullying and its effects. The students will be working on their posters in art class, but if they do not finish them they will need to finish them at home.

The following topics will be discussed during Bully Awareness Week. Students should choose one of these topics as a theme for their posters:

- Be kind. Respect the differences of others.
- Speak up! Try to help others who are being bullied.
- Include everyone...especially students who are left out.
- Report bullying. If you know that someone is being bullied, tell an adult.
- Choose kind words. Even if you are joking, don't say mean things.
- Don't use your computer or cell phone to send mean messages or rumors. (Cyberbullying-Upper grades)

Please have your posters turned in by October 10th so that we can hang the posters to display throughout the school during Bully Awareness Week. Posters will be displayed if they are handed in after the 10th, but they will not have a chance to be judged for the contest, so try to turn them in on time!

We have had several local companies donate fun prizes for the winners of the contest including: Roxberry Smoothies, Orange Leaf Yogurt, Arctic Circle, and Smart Cookie Company. The art teacher will choose the top 5 posters per class, and those students will get a prize and also will be entered into the final contest for the grade-level prizes. Make sure your name, grade, and classroom teacher are on the back of the poster. Please try to keep your poster positive and have fun helping to spread the word about bullying!

Lead Team Members will assist at the school with lunchtime duties, helping during assemblies, serving as office assistants as needed, and other assignments that will help build leadership opportunities. Additionally, Lead Team members will serve as CONFLICT MANAGERS. Conflict management is a process whereby children use skills they've learned in a workshop to help resolve problems between their peers. This process focuses on resolving conflicts peacefully by listening and repeating the story of the conflict, brainstorming solutions with both parties, and coming to a resolution to which all parties can agree.

IF ACCEPTED, I WILL FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES OF CONFLICT MANAGEMENT AND ATTEND ALL TRAINING MEETINGS. 1 UNDERSTAND THAT A CONFLICT MANAGER MUST

Listen to kids in a conflict without taking sides

- Try to understand the thoughts and feelings of kids in conflict
- · Listen to each kid's story without judging or blaming
- Listen without interrupting
- · Be trusted not to discuss the conflict with other students
- · Help kids who are mad at each other work together peacefully
- Help kids in a conflict work out their own agreement rather than tell them how to solve their problem

• Help other people no matter how they look, dress or speak.

Make up Picture Day Is Coming




