Dear Parents,

Students are working very hard to reach our goal of 128,205 reading tickets for the Ken Garff Road to Success Reading Challenge. Reading five days a week earns a student one ticket and seven day a week earns a student 2 tickets. We will have another bike drawing after the February reading calendars are collected. Reading is fundamental to all learning and as a school, we are dedicated to work in partnership with families to promote literacy development for all students.

Reading fluency has been identified by the National Reading Panel as a key component in teaching children to read. "Fluent readers can read text with speed, accuracy, and proper expression. Fluency depends upon well-developed word recognition skills, but such skills do not inevitably lead to fluency. It is generally acknowledged that fluency is a critical component of skilled reading." (NRP, 2000) One of the main processes to help children improve fluency is through repeated readings. Have your child read a passage "cold" then reread the passage again a few times. Finally, have the child "pass off" the passage. This could be a fun activity to do with a timer.

Our school uses the DRA (Developmental Reading Assessment) as one assessment for reading. Another assessment we use in 1st through 3rd grades is DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills). Teachers use

these assessments to pinpoint areas that students may need more support. While a student may do well in many areas, teachers use these assessments to guide specific instruction on what will benefit individual students.

Most importantly, thank you for taking time each day to read with your child! No other factor will help your child become a better reader than having time each day to read with you.
