MATH: The goal is for each of these students to improve by either 25 percentage points or reach/surpass 80% mastery on the grade level final benchmark assessment given in April 2012 as compared to the initial evaluation in August 2011.

READING: The goal is for each of these students to make at least one year's growth according to the assessment given at the end of April 2012 as compared to the initial evaluation in August 2011.
