- 1. Natalie Hill welcomes everyone
- 2. Proposed approval of last meeting's minutes. Minutes were approved unanimously.
- 3. By-Laws—A revised version of the By-laws will be emails to all members for review. These will be approved at the next meeting.
- 4. Safety:
 - a. Door BlØk for all classrooms. Their purpose is to enable teachers to lock doors quickly, efficiently, and safely.
 - b. Coatrooms will be the location for students to hide in the event of a Lock-Down. Coatroom windows will be covered.
 - c. Currently, all rear exterior doors are locked all day. The only entry door that is open is the main front door.
 - d. Officer Call is our "NOVA" officer and makes a strong presence at the school. We discussed additional ways to have a strong police presence at the school. One school in the area has a program called "Cop Stop." The school provides coffee, water, donuts, cookies, etc. and cops can come by any time to visit and have a snack.
 - e. We had a discussion of other various safety choices.
 - f. David reported that the Lehi PD is in the process of developing programs to help schools have efficient safety

programs and procedures for lockdown or other emergency situations.

- g. David asked that people email him with any other concerns or ideas they have.
- 5. Review of School Goals (Austin Cowley)
