PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Traverse Mountain Community

I grew up watching Mister Rogers Neighborhood on PBS. Every day I remember Fred Rogers talking about words like, special, feelings, make-believe, and wonder. I think about the challenges kids face today, and I think about how much we could learn from the gentle daily conversations Mr. Rogers had with the television audience. He talked about how each child is special just the way they are. He taught us that feelings are okay to have, and how to talk about being angry, or sad. He taught us how powerful our imaginations could be, and how wondering things can lead us to questions, and ultimately learning something new.

Today at the beginning of the day I watched teachers greeting their students as they arrived for the day. It reminded me of Mr. Rogers' opening sequence. The teachers made the students feel special, they prepared them for both learning, and make-believe. This is one of the most rewarding aspects of working in a school, meeting every student every day with excitement and wonder.

I hope you take a moment this month and talk to your child about how special they are. Think about the lyrics to the song Mr. Rogers sang at the close of each episode, and how important it is that each our children here at Traverse Mountain know that they are loved, and that we are here for them.

It's such a good feeling
To know you're alive.
It's such a happy feeling;
You're growing inside.
And when you wake up ready to say:
I think I'll make a snappy new day.
It's such a good feeling,
A very good feeling.
The feeling you know, that I'll be back
When the day is new.
And I'll have more ideas for you.
And you'll have things you'll want to talk about.
I will too.
