Dear Traverse Mountain Community

When I was younger I spent a lot of time skiing. I learned a lot of life lessons while on the slopes, and many of them the hard way. From checking for loose clothing on a ski lift, or staying in bounds, to changing conditions, I learned a lot of valuable lessons above 8,000 ft. During this time of the school year however, I think about one lesson I learned the hard way, and how it can apply to the end of a school year.

One day I was skiing at Sundance as an over-confident 7th grader. My friends and I liked to ski under the lift so people could see us. This, I learned, was not without its dangers. At the end of one spring day I was nearing the end of a run under the lift. I looked ahead at the run, which required at least three more turns in order to stay in control. On this particular run under the lift at the end of the day, I looked ahead and saw three more turns. My legs were tired, and I thought maybe I didn't need to commit to all those turns. So, I let go, stopped turning, and let my speed pick up. This, it turned out, was a big mistake. After skipping the first turn, I was close to being out of control. When I was where I should have been making my second turn I was out of control. I tried to fix my mistake by that third turn, but by then it was far too late. I hit a bump, got thrown

Had I made those three simple turns, I would not have fallen nor spent the next 15 minutes gathering up my equipment. As we approach the end of the school year, let's make sure we stay in control. Do the simple things that help us finish strong.
